#### Mathematics

During Maths, this half term, we will begin by looking at the composition of the number 5 and recap previous learning. From this we will move on at measuring capacity, comparing length and comparing height.

We will then grow our numbers further by looking at 6, 7 and 8. Alongside this we will look at one more and one less. We will also look at doubling numbers to 8 and explore odd and even numbers.

### **Nursery Rhymes**

Children love to sing and can learn from singing nursery rhymes. The following nursery rhymes below are a great start:

- 5 speckled frogs
- 5 currant buns
- 5 little ducks
- 5 little men in flying saucer
- 5 little monkeys

Compare the weight of everyday objects at home.
Which is the lightest? Which is the heaviest? Can you find an object heavier than.?

Capacity- water play with different containers.
Which container holds the most/least? Encourage
the use of the vocabulary, full, half full and empty.

#### **Number Activities:**

Practise adding two groups of objects together to find the total. Encourage and model accurate counting to enable precision.

#### Understanding the World

This half term, the topic is 'People Who Help Us'.

Children will learn about people in the community who help us:

- Firefighters
- Doctors
- Police Vets
- Teachers

Children will be introduced to different jobs such as farmer, hairdresser and retail workers. Children will be encouraged to compare photographs of people who help us now compared to then and talk about what is the same or different.

They will learn about celebrations such as:

- Chinese New Year
- Shrove Tuesday
- Ash Wednesday
- Lent

They will find out about where and how these are celebrated around the world.



Children will also explore the season of Winter and look at the changes in the environment.

Discuss with your child at home about people in the local community and how they help us. Go for a walk in the local area and point out where the fire station, doctors and police station is.

Children can research the job they would like to do when they are older! What skills do they need to learn and develop to do that job?

When going on a walk watch out for the signs of Winter. Talk about the cold weather, it getting dark earlier, animals hibernating and the bare branches on the trees.

## Expressive Arts and Design

During child initiated learning pupils will have access to a wide variety of creative materials and will be able to express their own creativity. Pupils will be able to access a variety of small world and role play activities to develop expressive language.

Children will also make a toy car using dowels and wheels. They will design, make, test and evaluate it in groups.

Pupils will develop their repertoire of Nursery Rhymes, Action Songs and themed songs. The Nursery rhymes covered this half term are:

- Doctor Foster
- London Bridge is Falling Down
- Old Mother Hubbard
- Polly Put The Kettle On
- It's Raining, It's Pouring

Use playdough to practise rolling, shaping and moulding their own creations.
