Mrs Brownsword who is one of our office staff is moving over to Heathfield Primary School. We will welcome Miss Griffiths from the 14th March.



Covid Procedures

With each newsletter I write, I always have a covid update. There has been much in the media about the changes to the legal requirement to isolate if someone tests positive for covid. Unfortunately, this is quite misleading as it is still recommended that someone who tests positive should avoid being in contact with people. The guidance for schools has remained, on the whole, the same as before the holidays. The guidance we must now follow states:

'If you have COVID-19 you can infect other people from 2 days before your symptoms start, and for up to 10 days after. You can pass on the infection to others, even if you have mild symptoms or no symptoms at all. If you have COVID-19 you should stay at home and avoid contact with other people.'

'Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting.'



If your child tests positive for covid then you must contact school to inform us and follow the above testing guidance. Your cooperation with this is much appreciated as we try to ensure that we play our part in stopping the spread.

Bikes and Scooters at School


Staying active is really important and biking or riding a scooter to school is a great way to do this. Please can you make sure that if your child brings their bike or scooter to school that they come off it before they come onto the school grounds and push it into school. This really helps to minimise accidents before and after school.

Parent Consultations – Reception, Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6

Teachers are looking forward to speaking to you on Tuesday 8th March or Wednesday 9th March for our parent consultation meetings. You should have received a slip to let you know when your appointment will be. If you have not returned a letter stating a preferred date or time then your child's teacher will send you an appointment. Depending on where in school the teacher is phoning from, the caller ID on your phone may be the school number or may be 'Number Withheld' or 'No caller ID'. Please be prepared to answer the call as it helps staff make sure they keep to their timetables for the evening.

World Book Day – Thursday 3rd March

World Book Day is always something we look forward to at Northwood – the staff as much as the children! Reading is at the heart of our curriculum and World Book Day gives us an opportunity to celebrate it. The children took part in lots of activities over the day, including sharing books and reading together. Your child will have received a book token that they can take to lots of shops and exchange for a special World Book Day title or they can use it to get £1 off a book of their choice.
