Curriculum Area	Nursery	Home Enrichment Activities	
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	Children will have the opportunity to share their thoughts and feelings in circle time. Pupils will be encouraged to talk about their likes and dislikes and begin to identify similarities and differences between themselves and others. Children will consolidate their understanding of the Nursery rules and routines. We use the visuals below to help the children understand Nursery behaviour expectations.	Reinforce expected behaviour in the home setting. Discuss the consequences of inappropriate behaviour/actions. Talk about feelings with your child and help them to understand: happy, sad, angry and scared. Encourage them to express how they might be feeling.	
Physical Development	<ul> <li>Children will develop their hand and eye co-ordination and access daily parachute games and ring games.</li> <li>Pupils will be able to access the sand pit to practise digging and to strengthen core muscles.</li> <li>Through child initiated learning pupils will begin to explore different ways of travelling and will learn to negotiate space.</li> <li>Pupils will engage in a variety of fine motor control activities including: threading, construction and mark making activities.</li> <li>Pupils will practise health and self-care routines including: hand washing, blowing their nose and dressing for the outdoor environment.</li> </ul>	Encourage your child to be fully proficient when using the toilet and washing their hands. Support pupils to develop the ability to cope with dressing and undressing. Wash Your Hands!	

Communication and Language	Children will be encouraged to take part in circle time activities within small groups and whole class. There will be lots of opportunities for pupils to express their views, share stories and become confident to speak in a familiar group.	Encourage your child to speak to a range of adults in the hom setting. Encourage your child to ask and answer simple questions.		
Literacy	Pupils will have the opportunity to engage in role play to develop their expressive language.	Please ensure that your child has something to share in the Home School Diary. This could be a sentence or two written b you, a photograph or caption or an artefact. Please see Nurser Display Board for further ideas.		
	Blast Language intervention will be delivered to target pupils to develop their expressive and receptive language and early language development.	Encourage your child to sing simple songs and add actions ar body percussion (clapping/clicking) to the songs.		
	Children will begin to recall story events and will have the opportunity to re-enact stories in their play. Pupils will explore the following stories in class.	Encourage your child to identify environmental sounds in t environment and home setting. Read a story to your child every day. Encourage your child talk about the illustrations in the stories. Understanding the World	Pupils will learn about their bodies and the four senses. They will begin to observe similarities and differences between themselves and others. They will explore the role of the nurse/doctor.	Encourage your child to observe and describe the signs Autumn. Collect fallen leaves and allow your child to produ leaf collage pictures. Your child may like to bring fall Autumnal leaves to school.		
	Pupils will care for the garden in the Autumn and ensure that the pumpkins continue to grow in readiness for Halloween. They will explore the signs of Autumn in the outdoor classroom and wider school grounds and will access Autumn in the Seasonal Investigation Station.	Autumn		
Expressive Arts and Design	Children will explore simple drawing techniques and will begin to use different line types to create representations: long lines, short lines, curved lines, thin lines, thick lines etc.	Encourage your child to sing songs from Nursery in the hon setting.
