Mathematics	During Maths, this half term, we will start by looking at compositions of the number 5 using 2 numbers then moving onto equal and unequal groups. From this we will look at measuring capacity, comparing length and comparing height.  We will then grow our numbers further by looking at 6,7 and 8. ### **Number Activities:**

Practise adding two groups of objects together to find the total. Encourage and model accurate counting to enable precision.

# Understanding the World

Children will learn about different types of dinosaurs. They will investigate herbivores, carnivores and omnivores and have an exciting dino egg experience! The children will then lead into learning about other reptiles and cold blooded animals that hatch from eggs. The children will be investigating fossils and make their own dino print fossil.

Children can research their favourite dinosaurs - their size, where they lived and what they eat. Andy's dinosaur adventures on BBC shows simple snap shots of dinosaur facts for the children to note.



Children will also explore the season of Winter and look at the changes in the environment. They will look at celebrations such as New Year, Chinese New Year and Valentine's day. They will find out about where and how these are celebrated around the world.

Discuss what hatches from an egg as well as dinosaurs. This will lead on to Spring 2 topic of 'animals and their babies'.

When going on a walk watch out for the signs of Winter. Talk about the cold weather, it getting dark earlier, animals hibernating and the bare branches on the trees.



# Expressive Arts and Design

Children will explore collage and sculpture and will learn how to use a range of techniques. They will develop the skills needed to create their own clay dinosaur.

During child initiated learning pupils will have access to a wide variety of creative materials and will be able to express their own creativity. Pupils will be able to access a variety of small world and role play activities to develop expressive language.

Pupils will develop their repertoire of Nursery Rhymes, Action Songs and themed songs. The Nursery rhymes covered this half term are:

- London Bridge is falling down
- Old Mother Hubbard
- Polly Put the Kettle On
- It's Raining It's Pouring
- Five Little Monkeys

Use playdough to practise rolling, shaping and moulding their own creations.
