We are delighted to be able to offer face-to-face consultation appointments this year as well as phone appointments, however, we did not have as big a response from parents for appointments as we expected. This is the first time since Covid we've been able to open up our school to the parent carer community on Tuesday 8th November and Wednesday 9th November – you should have received a slip with your appointment details on. Teachers have allocated a 10 minute slot for each child so it is quite a tight schedule. Our Community Matters

The Community Police visited school to ask us to communicate with parents about the fact that the junction between Leyburn Road and Fitzwilliam Drive is being closely monitored by the police due to many drivers going the wrong way down this one-way street. Some of the driving on this road could be very dangerous for our children and families who live and play in this area. They have informed us that anyone caught doing this will be issued a fine and will receive penalty points on their license. Over this half-term, some of our children will be helping the PCSOs to monitor this area and raise awareness of the risks involved. Let's do all we can to keep the roads and community safe for children and families.

Dates for your Diary

- Week commencing 7th November: Money Talk Week children will be considering why money is important and what their options are with it. Do they save or spend? What are the benefits and drawbacks of both?
- **Friday 11**th **November:** The children will take part in a minute silence and be taught about the importance of Armistice or Remembrance Day.
- Week commencing 14th November: Anti-Bullying Week this year, the theme is 'Reach Out.' Over the week, the children will focus on a different theme each day:

Monday 14th **November** – Odd Sock Day – Children are invited to wear odd socks to school to celebrate uniqueness. **Tuesday 15**th **November** – Northwood Smile Day – We all smile in the same language! Let's pass on a smile.

Wednesday 16th November – Random Acts of Kindness Day – A little kindness can make a big difference.

Thursday 17th November – E-Safety Day – Children will explore e-safety and why it is important.

Friday 18th **November**– Children in Need Day: 'The Great Spotacular' – children can come to school looking as spotty as they like. If you would like to donate to Children in Need, please send money into school with your child. We will see how many Pudsey faces we can fill with the coins the children bring!

- Week commencing 21st November: Road Safety Week this is the UK's biggest road safety event and this year's theme is 'Safe roads for all.' The children will consider how the roads can be made safe for everyone through safe roads, safe vehicles and safe speeds.
- Week commencing 28th November: National Tree Dressing this is celebrated in different cultures all over the world. It focuses on the importance of trees and we will be encouraging the children to value and care for them. We will also dress the school Christmas tree this week.
- Tuesday 6th December: Nursery Christmas Stay and Play session more details about time and tickets to follow.
- Wednesday 7th December: Reception Nativity Performance more details about time and tickets to follow.
- Thursday 8th December: Christmas Dinner Day we will send out a letter soon to children who normally have a packed lunch so they can choose to have a Christmas dinner that day. Your child can wear a festive top today if they would like to.
