Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to Northwood. We hope you all had a fantastic time together. This half term is always one of the highlights of the school year, it is very busy and packed with fun and opportunities to further develop your children's lives and experiences. We are always striving to 'grow success' and look forward to making memories for all of our children during this half term.

Parent/Carer Consultations: Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th November

We are delighted to offer face to face consultation appointments this year and are looking forward to welcoming our families into the school building. Our Year 6 Pupil Representatives will be on hand to welcome you into school, show you where to go to speak to the teachers and offer you a tour of the school. These are new positions to provide our oldest children with more responsibility in and around school. If your child is in Year 3 to Year 6, the meeting will take place in the school hall. If your child is in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, your meeting will be held in the classrooms. The children's work will also be available for you to have a look at before or after your meeting has taken place. We are constantly trying to ensure that we offer our families the best education we can and ask that you complete the questionnaire that will also be available in school. Please note that sometimes appointment times may overrun-please be mindful of this when you come into school.



Anti-Bullying Week - Make a noise about bullying: Week beginning 13th November Although bullying at Northwood is rare, it is important that we spend time as adults and children coming together to discuss what we mean by bullying behaviour, how we can tell the difference between 'banter' and bullying and how to make changes to reduce bullying type behaviours, both in school and outside in the community. During this week in school all children will be taught:

- How to report bullying or anything they are worried about
- The difference between banter and bullying type behaviour
- That there are people who care and can help if they are struggling with a bullying-related issue.

Northwood's Anti-Bullying policy can be found on the school's website in the 'policies' section under the 'statutory' tab at the top of the website.

Each day we will come together through a range of activities and themes:

- Monday 13th November-'Odd Sock Day' in school-the whole school community is invited to wear odd socks to school to recognise and celebrate our differences
- **Tuesday 14th November**-'Smile Day'-as kindness is one of our key virtues we will be encouraging our community to respond to each other with smiles. Smiles are the building blocks of warm, caring and responsive relationships.
- Wednesday 15th November-'Positive Affirmation Day'-we will focus on the benefits of positive words and thoughts and how powerful these can be
- **Thursday 16th November**-'Stay safe online'-E-safety is at the heart of our computing curriculum. Being safe online means individuals are protecting themselves and others from online harm and risks.
- Friday 17th November-'Children in Need Day'-the whole school community is invited to wear bright clothes to school to celebrate this important event.

On Friday 17th November, we will celebrate 'Children in Need Day' in school. This will be a non-uniform day and we ask that the school community wears bright clothes on this day. We will have our special 'copper coin challenge' on this day too. Please would you look in your pockets, drawers and purses (and down the side of the sofa) and allow your children to bring in copper coins (and silver ones too if you wish) to decorate as many Pudsey Bear faces as we possibly can. All money raised will go to this very important charity and support children who aren't as fortunate as us.

Back by popular demand is Northwood's Christmas Fair. This special event hasn't taken place since before COVID and we are planning on making this event a huge success. This will take place at Northwood on Friday 8th December from 3.30pm to 5.30pm.
