Apart from Nursery the school gates are opened promptly at 8:45am for all of our children. Our gates are closed at 8:55am. Children should come to school as close to 8.45am as possible because we have introduced a range of early morning learning activities for all of our children. This includes reading, number work, times table work, opportunities to complete pieces of work from previous days, and completing corrections. It is really important that you work with us to promote good habits linked to attendance and especially punctuality.

Safe school site

Please remember the following when in the school grounds:

- Bikes and scooters must be not be ridden on the school site at all. This is to ensure that our whole school community is safe and there are no unnecessary accidents.
- Where possible lock bikes and scooters that are left in our school bike sheds.
- No animals of any kind are allowed on school property. This includes the carrying of small dogs.
- Vaping and smoking are not allowed anywhere on the school site.
- We encourage everyone to stick to the paths when walking around school and wherever possible please stay off the school grass.
- Please do not let your children walk on the walls around the school building. We do not want any child to suffer an injury that can be avoided.

Reading at Home

Instilling a love of reading gives a child a head start on expanding their vocabulary and building independence and self-confidence. It helps children learn to make sense not only of the world around them but also people, building social-emotional skills and of course, imagination. At Northwood we take every opportunity to promote the love of reading and we hope this extends to their time outside of school. Children will begin to bring reading books home from school very shortly and we ask that you take some time to encourage and listen to your children read regularly.

In the past we have asked you to sign reading records to show that you have supported your child in their reading journey. This academic year we taken the decision to stop using reading records — many schools have already done this to great effect. Ideally children should read every day, but 3 times a week as a minimum will ensure that our children continue to develop the skills that they require to be successful in the future.
