A Message from Mrs Beach, Executive Head Teacher



New Staffing at Northwood

- Miss Kelly (currently Assistant Head Teacher) has been appointed as Deputy Head Teacher at Northwood from September.
- Mrs Negus (currently Assistant Head Teacher and SENDCo) is expecting a baby! Her maternity will begin in September. In her absence Miss Hindmarsh (currently Nursery teacher) has been appointed to take over the role until Mrs Negus returns.
- From September, there will be a new Assistant Head Teacher at Northwood Mr Tapner. He is joining us from Park End Primary School in Middlesbrough.
- We will have three new teachers at Northwood in September Miss Bacon, Miss Curtis and Miss Welford.

Uniform and PE Uniform

PE kit is a key part of our school uniform, having the right kit ensures children are not restricted when taking part in sporting activities and that the clothes they wear at home do not get damaged.

Our school PE kit is:

- A pair of plain black shorts
- A standard white T-Shirt
- Plimsolls and/or trainers
- Hair should be neat and tidy and any hair accessories such as clips, slides, beads etc should be kept to a minimum.
- Jewellery, with the exception of one pair of stud style earrings, and make up (including nail varnish) should not be worn in school. Over this year, we have seen an increase in the number of children wearing jewellery to school and on PE days as well as nail varnish and fake nails. If children have to wear earrings then they should be a simple studs. There are all sorts of health and safety risks with wearing jewellery and having fake nails. If a child were to have an accident then a key thing we may look for is circulation in the fingers, which is impossible if a child is wearing fake nails or nail varnish. Teachers will be reminding children of these rules across this half term and in September. Children will be asked to remove jewellery whilst in school and remove fake nails and nail varnish at home. If your child is wearing jewellery they will be asked to take it off and you may be contacted by the class teacher to remind you that this is not appropriate. If your child comes to school with nail varnish or fake nails they will also be reminded of the school rules and you may receive a reminder from the teacher. I realise that children like to follow fashion, however, we would really appreciate your support with enforcing the school policy around this issue. We have a range of PE kit in school for children who continue to wear inappropriate clothing
