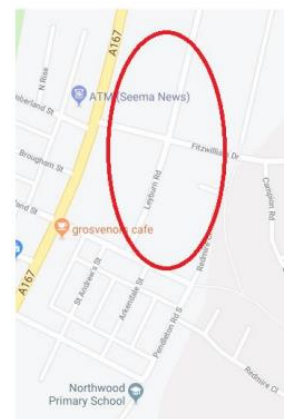
A huge Northwood congratulations to Mrs Harrington (previously Miss Wake) who got married over the Summer holidays.

Our Community Matters

Over the Summer holidays and at the start of this term, local residents have complained to the police and council about reckless and dangerous driving. The Community Police visited school to ask us to communicate with parents about the fact that the junction between Leyburn Road and Fitzwilliam Drive is being closely monitored by the police due to many drivers going the wrong way down this one-way street. They have informed us that anyone caught doing this will be issued a fine and 3 penalty points on their license. Let's do all we can to keep the roads and community safe for children and families.



Covid Procedures for September

As you will know, the rules around isolation for people with Covid changed in August; this has resulted in a shift of guidance for schools too. If your child has any of the common Covid symptoms you must keep them at home and book a PCR test. A Lateral Flow Test (LFT) does not detect Covid in the same way and so shouldn't be used for anyone who has symptoms. If the child then tests positive we ask that you contact school by phoning the school office as soon as you can or contacting our Facebook page. The child who tests positive must isolate for 10 days and you should be contacted by Test and Trace and given guidance on rules for the rest of the family. If someone has tested positive in a class there is no need for any other member of the class to isolate. We will send a text message to families to recommend children are taken for a PCR test to check they don't have Covid and ask you to be extra vigilant when looking for signs and symptoms, but children without symptoms must still come to school.



PE Days and Kit

Our school PE days are scheduled to ensure classes have adequate time in the school hall to complete their lessons should the weather not be appropriate to go outside, which as we move further into this term happens more often. This year we have tried to keep this system as simple as possible and ask for Year 1-Year 6 children to come to school in their kits on just one day a week. We ask that Reception children have their PE kit in school to change in to when it is their PE time. Wherever possible we will keep this day the same, however, Mrs Taylor (our PE lead) is always looking for opportunities to bring in exciting experiences and professional coaches for our children which means your child's PE day may change for a set number of weeks. will aim to give you notice of these changes when it happens but please be assured that if your child comes to school in their uniform instead of their kit, each class has spares that get washed regularly that they can wear. It has been fantastic to see children in their correct PE kit when they come to school. As the weather gets colder, your child can wear plain black jogging bottoms/ leggings as part of their PE kit.
