<u>Nursery</u>

This half term the children in Nursery have learnt about 'New Life'. They began the term by learning about plants. They listened to a range of stories and we talked about what a plant needs in order to grow and the best way to look after them. The children planted beans when reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and have enjoyed watering them and watching them grow. The children have spent lots of time learning outdoors planting and watering our garden to prepare it for spring time. They have sewn wildflower seeds, planted bulbs and even potatoes.

The Life Cycle of a Butterfly

This half term began with the arrival of 4 tiny caterpillars into nursery. The children have watched them eat, grow and watched them form into a pupa. They have been waiting patiently to see them transform into a butterfly! The children have loved experiencing holding the caterpillars as they've grown. The children have learnt a lot about the life cycle of a butterfly and can name the four stages. They enjoyed reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carl and learning more about what caterpillars should eat and their habitats.















Reception

This half term Reception children have been exploring plants and growth naming parts of a plant, naming common garden plants, and discussing how growing conditions can affect them. The children have planted seeds, bulbs and flowers in the outdoor area and have been making sure they have enough water. They have explored growing plants indoor in other ways by using cress seeds grown on cotton wool and discussed what would happen if we didn't give the plants light and water.

Holi and Easter

The children have been learning about the festival of Holi, a Hindu festival that celebrates spring, love, and new life. We had a colour festival of our own that the children loved. We have explored the Christian celebration of Easter and the story behind why it is celebrated; the children have made cards in celebration of this.



















Coming up.....Reception will be having some very special visitors after the Easter holidays. Duck eggs will be arriving in class for the children to observe the hatching phase and the development of the ducklings over the first 2 weeks of term before they move on to their forever home. We will update you on their progress and the names they ae given by the children.



Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised

The children have continued to practise blending Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds to read CVC words (consonant-vowel-consonant). They have also looked at Phase 2 and 3 tricky words.
